Minnesota Colon Cancer Research Fund Research Grants for PhD Students, Postdoctoral Fellows, and MD Physician Scientists Conducting Research in Symptom Management and Survivorship Care

Grant amounts:

\$50,000 - \$75,000

Who is eligible?

PhD students and postdoctoral fellows, one principal investigator per application

MD physician scientists in a research fellowship track or within the first three years of a faculty appt in which at least 50% time is spent on research

Focus:

Research to find causes, cure, and/or prevention of colon and rectal cancer with an emphasis on reducing the burden of symptoms and improving quality of life in individuals with colon and rectal cancer

Items acceptable to request:

Student/fellow/MD stipends, or postdoc salary – required

Travel to present findings at a national meeting - required

Other acceptable expenses: research equipment, services and supply expenses, membership dues, computer

Items not acceptable to request:

Tuition and indirect costs

Application format:

- 1. Title
- 2. Abstract (500 words limit) description of research in lay language for a nonscientist
- 3. Biographical Information –use NIH biosketch format
- 4. Description of research plan part 3 pages for the description of the research plan, 11 pt arial, single spaced with 1 inch margins, no appendix figures/tables must be included within the page limits
 - a. Present knowledge of field

- b. Hypothesis and specific aims
- c. Experimental approach how will the aims be accomplished
- d. Significance of the proposed project to the area of colon cancer research
- e. Future plans
- f. References (not included in word/page count)
- 5. Statement of career goals (300 words)
- 6. Budget with justification
- 7. Animal and/or human protocol approvals will be required for start of funding, not required for proposal submission.
- 8. Letter of support from advisor including whether there is overlap between the proposed work and the funded work in the mentors laboratory
- 9. Letter of support indicating at least 50% research time; this can be in the same letter outlined in #8 or a separate letter from leadership

Application Due Date:

Email your intent to apply by **October 6, 2023**. Submit a pdf of your application to hope@minnesotacolorectal.org by 5:00pm on **November 3, 2023**.

It is expected one grant will be funded through this mechanism.
